

 - To enhance quality and make higher education accessible to all, the College has embarked upon the project of vocationalisation of education. To meet this objective the college introduced vocational courses. To make the students economically independent two vocational subjects were introduced at undergraduate level:
 - (1) Office Management and Secretarial Practices (1998)
 - (2) Computer Application in Social Sciences (2004)
 - Students were given one month training in industries and other enterprises .Besides receiving training outside the college , the students were trained in the College throughout the year in Computer Typing , Scanning , Library Management and photocopy.
