Activities at departmental level

1. The major activity of the College was to get B.Voc. Degree programme sanctioned by the UGC on 4.5.2014 after screening of proposal at National Level with a grant of 1.85 crore in the two trades – Journalism and Mass Communication & Fashion Design and Embroidery. The 60% curriculum of both the courses were approved by the SSC (Sector Skill Council) due to delayed response from the University the admission could be made in July 2015 with the permission of UGC letter No. F2-110/2014(NSQF) dt.13th April 2015. On 7th July 2015 the counseling and admission process started and the classes began from 25th July. The first semester examination of both 60% of Skill Component and 40% of General education was over in the end of December 2015 and the 2nd Semester is in process. 2. FASHION DESIGN & EMBROIDERY TRADE : A REPORT

B.VOC. is a special programme of the Ministry of HRD and UGC. It is a programme to align higher education with the emerging needs of the economy to ensure that the graduates of higher education system have adequate knowledge and skills for employment. The higher education system has to incorporate the requirements of various industries in its curriculum as they will provide specific job roles to students for gaining appropriate employment. The industry representatives would be an integral part of the B.VOC. Programme. The skill development component of the curriculum would be relevant so as to make it the industry-fit as per their requirement and focuses on work-readiness skills in each of the three years.

University Grants Commission had sanctioned our College B.VOC. Degree Programme in the trade of Fashion Design & Embroidery on 5th May 2014 but due to unavoidable circumstances the Programme could not start. The UGC acceded to our request and gave its permission again to start the programme from the session 2015-16 and sanctioned 50 seats in Fashion Design. According to UGC Guidelines Curriculum, every year of the B.VOC. Degree Programme would be a suitable mix of General Education and Skill Component. General Education Component shall have 40% of the total credits and 60% credits will be of Skill Component. The skill Component of the Fashion Design Curriculum is aligned to Qualification Pack(QPs)/National Occupational Standard (NOSs) of Apparel Made-ups and Home Furnishing Sector Skill Council, Gurgaon. Curriculum of skill component was approved on 17th September 2015 by AMH-SSC, Gurgaon. General Education component conforms to the University norms.

A developed Pattern Making and Drafting Lab and Stitching Lab/Workshop has been established. It provides facilities for face to face delivery of skills and hands-on practice. There are 10 Single Needle Lock Stitch Industrial machines, a fusing press, a steam press with water shifting plant and water tank, 5-pattern making table with stools. There are two embroidery machines along with an interlock machine, a Pico machine and 11 home sewing machines. There is also a smart class set-up.

Inauguration Ceremony of the course was held on 18th August 2015. Prof. Sangeeta Srivastava, Head Dept. of Home Science, University of Allahabad inaugurated the Fashion Design Lab/Workshop. Mr. Madhu Kapoor, M.D. Apparel Leather and Technics Pvt. Ltd., Bangalore was the Special Guest. On this occasion an exhibition was organized by the students. Mr. Madhu Kapoor extended his full support regarding signing MoU with our College and assured that he will provide whatever facilities we need.

The classes commenced from 25th July 2015. On 27th August students of Fashion Design visited Pantaloons, Max, Panchi, Fab India, and West side for Market Research and Trend analysis. They learnt about the different brands and designs in the market. On 27th October they visited ARAISH COLLECTION at Hotel Milan Palace, Civil Lines, Allahabad. On 5th Nov. Miss Vandana Rathore of NIFT, Delhi addressed the students. On 3rd Nov. 2015 Prof. P.K. Sahoo, Dept. Of Education, University of Allahabad addressed the students and informed them about the Skill Development Programme. The Principal, Nodal Officer and Faculty, Fashion Design visited ALT, Kanpur on 3rd Feb. 2016 to learn more about the infrastructure development, work schedule and teaching patterns as per industry requirements.

Internal assessments were conducted on 28th&29th Sept. and 14TH & 15th Nov. 2015. External assessment was held on 23rd Dec.2015. It was conducted by AMH-SSC, GURGAON. General Education assessment was held on 10th Feb. 2016.conducted by University of Allahabad. Thus, 1st semester assessment were completed. Classes of II semester are going on. After completing the II semester students will be assessed for NSQF Level 5 by concerned SSC and after completing the IV and VI semester students will be assessed for NSQF Level 6 and NSQF Level 7 respectively. NSQF Level 5 will be treated at par with Diploma and Level 6 will be treated as Advanced Diploma and after completing the 7th Level students will be awarded B.Voc. Degree by the University of Allahabad. Each level has at least one job role in the curriculum. It will be credit-based modular programme, wherein banking of credits for skill and general education components will be permitted so as to enable multiple exit and entry. This would enable the students to seek employment after any level of award and later join back as and when feasible to upgrade her qualification.

B.VOC - JOURNALISM AND MASS COMMUNICATION**

‘Skill Development in Higher Education’ is a global requirement special in India. It has been a long felt necessity to align higher education with the emerging needs of the economy so as to ensure that the graduates of higher education system have adequate knowledge and skills for employment and entrepreneurship. The University Grants Commission (UGC) had launched a scheme for skill development as part of higher education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc) degree with multiple entry and exit points for creating employable graduates. Fortunately the college has been sanctioned B.Voc Degree Programme in two trades -Journalism and Mass Communication and Fashion Design & Embroidery.

The trade Journalism and Mass Communication started with a vision that most of the girls who are doing B.A. are not getting vocational training and their studies do not help them in getting employed. By opting Journalism & Mass communication, girl students would get a chance to explore the world of mass media and Journalism. how news are collected, how they are given for print, who collects them and make a story, Girls are quite interested in seeing how production team works for television, how audio and video aids are used, how group of people work day and night to give us a morning news paper on time. All these things along with other interrelated fields are being taught. The course is designed in such a way so as to make students aware of what they need while in process of being a journalist and a media person.

On 7th July 2015 the counseling and admission process started in the college. The classes started from 25th July. On the same day the first orientation session was organized in which two eminent personalities from radio and television— Mr. Manjul Kishor Verma, Asstt. Director (Programme), AIR, Allahabad and Mr. Dinesh Singh, Bureau Chief, Zee Salam, Allahabad addressed the students. Mr. Manjul Kishore Verma motivated the students to take up career in journalism in the electronic media as numerous options are knocking at the gates of the students. He answered the queries of students and provided them intelligent tips to face the interview and carve out their way to success. He assured to provide full support to the department of journalism in this novel venture. Mr. Dinesh Singh encouraged the students to take into cognizance of all the angles of a professional course before offering it. He said that a professional course should be judged on four parameters –investment, time factor, job security and the cutting edge provided by the social media in the present scenario. He said the professional course of Journalism and Mass Communication through B.Voc. fulfils all four parameters.

On 29th March 2016, Dr. Rehana Tariq, Principal and Mrs. Naseha Usmani, Nodal Officer with two faculty members Ms. Sana Absar and Dr. Farah Hashim attended a meeting and training programme of Media and Entertainment Sector Skill Council of India at Mumbai of those Colleges who are offering the Course in the trade Journalism and Mass Com. sanctioned by the U.G.C. under B.Voc. Degree Programme. This meeting had two objectives – firstly to take stock of the situation of the B.Voc. programme in this Course, its Curriculum alignment with QPs (Qualification Packs) etc. and secondly to sign the MoU between Colleges and Industry partners so that students or trainees of this course can be placed after completion of two semester or more.

It came to our knowledge as a big surprise that among the Colleges who were representing their States from Kerala to Punjab, our College was the only College which was representing Uttar Pradesh in this skill. It was found in perfect alignment with the Sector Skill Council and U.G.C. guidelines. Chief Executive Officer Mr. A. Ramesh, Deputy Director Ms. Sonal Mathur and Head Content: MESC, Mr. S. Krishna have given their nod with few words of appreciation as our Ist semester examination of both 60% of Skill Component and 40% of General Education was over in the end of December 2015. Dr. Rehana Tariq, Principal as a Guest of Honour gave few suggestions from our side regarding course content to make it more relevant and to make the youth employable that were also accepted by the SSC team and the curriculum will be aligned with it in the next semester. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was also signed between our College and Media and Entertainment Sector Skill Council.

The message which is being carried to the public is that there is a lot of scope and job opportunities in this field. We are receiving calls from the media world to enlist our students for placement. No doubt, the B.Voc. Degree Programme for Skill Development is an enriching programme and preparing the youth for employment is a wonderful experience. More and more girls should join this course.

A Two-Day UGC-Sponsored National Seminar on *Unniswein Sadi Mein Urdu Adab-o-Sahafat : Munshi Dwarika Prasad Ufuq ke Khususi Hawale Se (17th – 18th February, 2016)* was organized by the Dept. of Urdu. The Keynote Lecture was delivered by Prof. Zafar Ahmad Siddiqui, Dept. of Urdu, AMU, Aligarh. Commenting on Urdu language he said that Urdu is a modern Indian language and its importance lies in the fact that it is spoken all over the country. Emphasizing his point he said that Urdu has a glorious past of six hundred years. In the later years Urdu extended its frontiers and developed as a language of lofty thoughts and expression. A unique quality of the language is that it has a rich treasure source borrowing from local dialects, Persian and Arabic. Since it has borrowed and regularly chiseled itself, it has been enriched by way of vocabulary and the content.

Speaking on Urdu Journalism he said that in the 19th century the publisher, Munshi Naval Kishore started the newspaper, Avadh in 1857. Initially it was published once a week then twice and later on by 1872 it became a daily newspaper. This newspaper is also a record of the historical and political happenings of the age. Commenting on the poet, Munshi Dwarika Prasad Ufuq Prof. Siddiqui said that Ufuq belongs to a family of poets and scholars. His ancestors were secular minded and admirers of Urdu. Besides they were modest to the core.

Speaking on the occasion the Guest of Honour, Dr. Komal Bhatnagar, Former Principal Arya Kanya Degree College, Allahabad said that Munshi Dwarika Prasad Ufuq belonged to a family of poets and scholars. His grandfather was a successful Persian poet and essayist. As a poet he was impressed by the Sufi idealism. His father was also a successful Urdu poet and started the printing press. Ufuq regularly contributed his poems to Munshi Naval Kishore's newspaper, *Avadh* which was the only newspaper in which news were presented in poetry. She said that Ufuq was a store house of knowledge and also contributed to Urdu Journalism immensely in the 19th century. This led to the emergence of a cultivated interest in Urdu Language and literature among even the less educated citizens of Lucknow. His sons started two newspapers in Urdu, *Tamannai* and *Mahr-e-Zarafat*.

Earlier welcoming the guests the Principal, Dr. Rehana Tariq said that seminar is based on a relevant topic. The College maintains the tradition of 'Hearing the Unheard' & 'Crowning the Uncrowned Personages'. Ufuq also known as *Malikush Showra* contributed his poems regularly to *Avadh*, the only newspaper in poetry published from Lucknow. He also translated *Ramayana* and *Mahabharata* in Urdu. His works are now recognized.

On this occasion the President of the Managing Committee of the College, Mrs. Rashida Khan blessed the students. The vote of thanks was delivered by Mrs. Zareena Begum, Asstt. Prof., Dept. of Urdu, HGDC, Alld. the inaugural session was conducted by Mrs. Naseha Usmani, Asso Prof., Dept. of Urdu and convener of the seminar.

Four technical sessions were held. Altogether 35 papers were presented by delegates from different Universities and colleges from all over the country. The first technical session 'Lucknow ka Tarikhi Pasmanzar aur Adab-o-Shafat par uske asraat'. Was presided by Dr. Asim Shahnawaz Shibli', Maulana Azad P.G., College, Kolkata. Human Resource Development and practices in globalized era is the strategic and coherent approach to the management of an organization's most valued assets, the people working there who individually and collectively, contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the business.

Keeping this in the mind Dept. of Economics decided to organize two day national seminar on “Human Resource Development in Twelfth Five Year Plan: Challenges & Possibilities” on 20th & 21th February 2016. The Chief Guest of the Inaugural Session was Prof. K.M. Ahmad, Vice-Chancellor, K.M.C. University, Lucknow. He emphasized on the importance of women's education. He elaborated that girls should also participate in decision making only then they can be empowered. He stressed upon the importance of education with reference to Quran. Prof. K.M. Ahmad referred to the war of Badar between Prophet Mohammad (PBUH) and Mushrequeen-e-Makkah in which Mushrequeen -e- Makkah was defeated and became prisoner of the war. The rich among them paid tax and were consequently freed. The poor who were unable to pay the tax had to teach ten people and win freedom for themselves. This incident exemplifies the importance of education as stressed by Prophet Mohammad (PBUH).

Dr. (Mrs). Rehana Tariq, Principal Hamidia Girls' Degree College welcomed all the guest and intellectuals. The keynote address was delivered by Prof. Ravi Srivastava, ,Dept. of Economics ,JNU, New Delhi. He highlighted the importance of education and skills in India with special reference to women. He elaborated upon the interrelationship between education and skills .He gave references of Radha Krishnan Commission, Kothari Commission and elaborated the aims and role of education. He

further stressed that the process of introspection should be developed through education only then we can transform a civilized society. In Kothari Commission it has been pointed that physical investment are means to an end and human resources are an end in itself. Education should provide widest opportunities to develop the potentialities of students. The process of independent thinking should be ignited. He elaborated the aims and goals of XI and XII Plan which are focused on access, equity and quality. In the XII five year plan it is mentioned that 50 crore people will be provided skill training.

The Presidential address was delivered by Prof. Ved Prakash Tripathi, Director, Deen Dayal Institute of Rural Development, Agra University. He highlighted the practical problems like less participation of women in the field of education, problem of quality in aided and self-financed institutions. Thereafter the technical sessions began. The first technical session focused on the theme 'Role of Skill and knowledge in HRD'. The Chairperson of the first technical session was Dr. Shakeel Ahrned, Dept. of Economics, Arts Science and Commerce College Pune. The theme of the second technical session was 'Component Role of Human Resource Development in Economic Development and HRD in neighboring countries'. The second technical was chaired by Dr. Hasemuddin, Dept. of Commerce, Arts Science and Commerce College, Pune and it was Co-Chaired by Dr. Kiran Singh, Dept. of Economics, A.U. The third technical session focussed on "HRD in field of Education & Role of Health, Nutrition and safe Drinking water in HRD". It was chaired by Prof. P.K. Ghosh, Dept. of Economics, University of Allahabad and it was co-chaired by Dr. Amitab Tewari, HoD Dept. of Economics A.D.C., The fourth & the last session was on theme "Role of Women in HRD And Role of Technical and Professional man power in economic development". The chairperson of this session was Prof. Jagdish Narayan, Dept. of Economics, University of Allahabad and it was co-chaired by Dr. Liticia Hermit, Dept. of Economics, E.C.C. Thirty eight papers from different states were presented.

The Valedictory Session was held on 21 February 2016. The Chief Guest of session was Prof. A.K. Mukherjee, Dean, C.D.C.UoA. He said that human beings and their physical entity only do not make - up human resource but their intellectual capacities make human resource. The present generation should add on to their Skill and Professional Development. The Presidential Address was delivered by Prof. P.N. Mehrotra, Former Head, Dept. of Economics, UoA. He said that Human Resource Development has three important aspects- Education, Skill and Health. Regarding the first aspect he said that education and especially professional education contributes largely towards human resource development. Regarding the second aspect he said that Skills are important and both Skill and Education should emphasize on development of quality. Regarding the third aspect he said that health is the most important aspect but the grim fact is that out of the total population of India, 4 crore children are stunted.

70% are under weight and 6 crore children come under wasted childhood. Stunted children are those children who do not grow in height according to their physical age, underweight children are those whose weights do not increase according to their physical age. Both these conditions are not for short term. They have lasting effect on their health conditions and future life. It finally leads to wasted childhood. He said that these health conditions are part of the Indian workforce. He added that poverty is not the only factor but under nourishment. According to the WHO data available, 51% the Indian population is anemic.

Prof. Jagdish Narayan, Dean, Faculty of Commerce said that a common perspective which emerged during the session was that we have to change the mindset of each every unit of the society in order to carry it forward. He said that we have to give decision making powers to women. Education of women should be given top priority and we should start creating more job opportunities for women. Dr. Javed Akhter, Special Guest of the session from the Dept. of Economics, University of Allahabad said that girls should move ahead for higher education to other Universities & Colleges.

In order to fulfill the objective, one day training programme on “HUMAN RIGHTS” sponsored by National Human Rights Commission, New Delhi was organized at Hamidia Girls Degree College on 28th November, 2015. The aim of this training was to spread human rights awareness among youth, as the University/College students have been the focus of the National Human Rights Commission, New Delhi.

The first technical session was based on *Introduction of Human Rights* which dealt on the following sub-themes - Constitutional Provisions, Universal Declaration on Human Rights, 1948, International Covenants regarding Human Rights were discussed. The resource person Mr. K.K. Rai, Senior Advocate, High Court, Allahabad explained various rights given in the constitution and stressed on its practical implementation. The topic of Second technical Session was *Human Rights Institutions In India*. The sub themes were – Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993, Composition and Functioning of NHRC/SHRCs, Other National/ State Commissions. The resource person Mr. M.A. Qadeer, Senior Advocate, High Court, Allahabad discussed Human Rights and its historical perspectives. He stressed that the last declaration of Prophet Mohammad^{pbuh} at Makka, Khutba Hajjatul Wida is the first ever charter of Human Rights based on equality, liberty and fraternity of mankind. He discussed the composition, functions and powers of National Human Rights Commission in India and State Human Rights Commissions in different states.

The topic of the third technical session was ***Rights of Women and Children***. The sub themes were UN Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, 1979 and its optional protocols, UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, 1989 and its optional protocols. The resource person Mr. R.K. Pandey, Senior Advocate, Ex President, Bar Association, High Court Allahabad emphasized that discrimination against women and children has been in existence in some form or other at international level though its intensity may vary from time to time or place to place. The protection of their rights is essentially a problem of common consciousness and mindset. The Conventions or Legislations can cure the symptoms of the disease but to cure the disease itself we have to devise a social revolution, a change in basic mindset. The topic of the fourth session was ***Rights of Other Vulnerable Group***. The sub themes were Bonded Labour Issues & the Bonded Labour System (Abolition) Act, 1976, Child Labour Issues & Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act, 1986 and SC/ST issues & Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989, Civil Liberties Act, 1988 & The Forest Rights Act, 2006. The resource person Mr. S.S. Tripathi, Labour Enforcement Officer, Labour Commission Office, Allahabad shed light on Child Labour and Bonded Labour. Due to social and economic factors- illiteracy, poverty and unemployment the problem of child labour compels the children to live in inhuman situations. He sensitized students regarding Act and provisions of eradicating child labour. He also gave example of Noble Prize Winner, Kailash Satyarthi whose humble effort '**Bachpan Bachao Andolan**' was internationally recognized. Mr. Tahir Hasan, member Managing Committee HGDC also interacted with the students and emphasized that human rights is related to the proper upbringing and rights of education are ignored specially in rural areas. He inspired students that they are blessed as human being and can attain their rights by using their potential in performance and encouraged them to become self reliant. The training programme concluded with a valedictory note and vote of thanks given by the convener, Dr. Yusuf Nafees, Associate Professor, Department of Medieval History. At the valedictory session it was pledged that the youth will strive to safeguard their rights by performing their duties. The training was interdisciplinary and student-centric. About 150 students, research scholars and Assistant and Associate professors of different departments of the colleges and Universities participated in the Training programme.
